## What it takes

Due to the high costs of running a FIRST Robotics Team, funding for the Chesaning High School Robotics Team is heavily reliant on donations from Local Businesses and Corporate Companies. These donations are used to cover registration fees, building materials, team expenses and general operation of the Chesaning High School Robotics Team. Partnership donations have any immense impact on the Gears of Fortune's students, by providing financial backing to create an once-in-a-lifetime experience.

By working hand-in-hand with companies to promote their business, students also gain an appreciation for "real-world" business sense, as well as an introduction to the corporate business atmosphere. 
